LETTER DATED 10 APRIL 1969 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF ISRAEL TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to refer to your letter of 27 March 1969 in which you informed me, in reply to my letter to you of 18 March 1969 (A/7528, S/9094), with reference to reports on the entry and stationing of Iraqi armed forces in Syria, that "UNTSO has been officially assured by competent Syrian authorities that no Iraqi troops have moved into Syria".

In the meantime, on 1 April 1969, the Acting Permanent Representative of Iraq addressed a letter to the President of the Security Council (S/9125) in which he confirms that Iraqi armed forces have entered Syria and are still stationed there. In that connexion your attention is drawn to my letter of today's date to the President of the Security Council (S/9145).

In the light of this, I have the honour, on instructions from my Government, to emphasize the importance and urgency of Your Excellency's efforts to obtain from the Government of Iraq an affirmation that Iraq accepts the Security Council cease-fire resolutions and that all Iraqi forces will respect the cease-fire.

I have the honour to request that this letter be circulated as a document of the General Assembly and Security Council.
