LETTER DATED 12 AUGUST 1968 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF SENEGAL ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to refer to your note No. PO 230 SORH (1-2) of 7 June 1968 drawing the attention of the Permanent Mission of Senegal to operative paragraph 18 of resolution 253 (1968), concerning the situation in Southern Rhodesia, which was adopted by the Security Council on 29 May 1968.

The Government of Senegal has already taken the necessary steps, pursuant to Security Council resolution 232 (1966), to prevent the export to Southern Rhodesia of the commodities enumerated in operative paragraph 2 of the above-mentioned resolution.

The Government of Senegal took immediate steps, pursuant to the provisions of operative paragraph 5 of Security Council resolution 253 (1968), to deny visas and entry to Senegal to all persons travelling on Southern Rhodesian passports.

The Government of Senegal is applying, without limitations of any kind, all the measures which the Security Council has decided should be adopted as sanctions against the Southern Rhodesian regime.

I should be grateful if you would have the text of this letter circulated as an official Security Council document.
