LETTER DATED 24 MAY 1968 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF JAMAICA ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to refer to document S/8592 of 21 May, circulated at the request of the Permanent Representative a.i. of Haiti to the United Nations.

In paragraph 6 of that document Jamaica is named as one of the countries which hostile aircraft might have used as a base for aerial bombing of the Republic of Haiti.

My Government has instructed me to inform you that Jamaica was not associated in any respect with aircraft that attacked the Republic of Haiti. The Haitian Consul in Kingston has already been informed by my Government that Jamaica was not a base from which any aircraft operated for bombing the Republic of Haiti.

It would be appreciated if this letter could be circulated as an official United Nations document.
