## Chapter __. Organization of the session

## A. Opening and duration of the session

1. The Commission on the Status of Women held its forty-eighth session at United Nations Headquarters from 1 to 12 March 2004. The Commission held

2. The session was opened by the Chairperson of the forty-eighth session of the Commission, Kyung-wha Kang (Republic of Korea), who also made a statement.

3. The session was attended by representatives of 45 States members of the Commission. Observers for other States Members of the United Nations and for non-member States, representatives of organizations of the United Nations system and observers for intergovernmental, non-governmental and other organizations also attended.
