REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON RELATIONS WITH THE HOST COUNTRY

Letter dated 4 November 1988 from the Permanent Representatives of Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, the German Democratic Republic and Poland to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

In their joint letters of 9 June 1988 1/ and 25 July 1988 2/ the Permanent Representatives of the People's Republic of Bulgaria, the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, the German Democratic Republic and the Polish People's Republic informed you about the imposition by the host country of travel restrictions on the personnel of the Permanent Missions, including persons temporarily assigned, of the said countries and, inter alia, called for your active assistance and for your intervention with the relevant United States authorities for the prompt revocation of those unlawful and discriminatory measures.

Since their own direct appeals have not met with any positive answer from the host country, the four Permanent Representatives would appreciate any information on the reaction of the host country to your intervention in this respect.

They also request you kindly to arrange for the distribution of the present letter, as well as of the above-mentioned joint letters, as documents of the forty-third session of the General Assembly under agenda item 137, "Report of the Committee on Relations with the Host Country".
