# Proposed strategic framework for the period 2006-2007

## Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Population Commission has before it for its consideration a note by the Secretary-General on the preparation of the strategic framework for the period 2006-2007. In this connection, attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 58/269 of 23 December 2003, in which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to prepare for submission to the Assembly at its fifty-ninth session a strategic framework for the biennium 2006-2007, comprising part one: plan outline, and part two: biennial programme plan, which would replace the four-year medium-term plan.

2. The attention of the Commission is drawn to rule 104.6 of the Regulations and Rules Governing Programme Planning, the Programme Aspects of the Budget, the Monitoring of Implementation and the Methods of Evaluation (ST/SGB/2000/8):

"The Secretary-General shall take appropriate measures to submit proposals to the sectoral, functional and regional bodies to enable them to review the relevant portions of the medium-term plan or its revisions with a view to facilitating their consideration by the Committee for Programme and Coordination and the General Assembly."

3. The Commission is invited to review the proposed biennial programme plan for the subprogramme on population contained in the annex to the present note and to provide its comments thereon to the Secretary-General. The biennial programme plan, modified as appropriate, will be submitted to the Committee for Programme and Coordination at its forty-fourth session. Its recommendations will be transmitted to the General Assembly at its fifty-ninth session. Also included in the annex are the legislative mandates for the subprogramme.

*Objective*: To promote policy debate on current and foreseeable population issues at the national and international levels with a view to enabling Member States to address effectively population and development issues.

The Population Division is responsible for the subprogramme. The objective will be achieved by:

• Providing substantive servicing to United Nations bodies, especially to the Commission on Population and Development, and assessing progress made in

the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development

- Facilitating discussion of key or emerging population issues by convening meetings of experts or government representatives
- Preparing comprehensive studies on population issues and population trends relative to the following topics: fertility, mortality, international and internal migration, HIV/AIDS, urbanization, population growth, population ageing, population prospects, population policy and population in relation to development
- Disseminating population information and policy-relevant findings in the area of population, particularly through the Population Division web site
- Building capacity to address population issues at the national level through workshops or the dissemination of technical material, such as manuals and software.
