秘书长的说明**

- 1. 大会在其第 58/213 号决议中决定,按照秘书长的说明(A/58/567 和 Corr. 1) 所载国际会议的暂行议事规则第 65 条,处理包括非政府组织在内的主要群体获得认可和参加审查《小岛屿发展中国家可持续发展行动纲领》执行情况国际会议的问题。大会在同一决议中决定,从事与国际会议主题有关的工作的非政府组织,目前未被经济及社会理事会认可的,可申请以观察员的身份参加国际会议及其筹备会议,但须经不限名额的筹备会议核可;
- 2. 经济和社会事务部通过可持续发展司要求希望出席这一国际会议及其筹备会议的所有未获认可的非政府组织和其他主要群体提交其申请及所需补充资料,以便进行评估。该司在联合国与非政府组织联络处及其它有关机构的酌情协助下,根据每个申请者的背景以及参与可持续发展问题的情况,特别是参与联合国环境与发展会议和小岛屿发展中国家可持续发展全球会议后续工作的情况,审查了其工作的相关性。
