LETTER DATED 29 NOVEMBER 1967 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF
SENEGAL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On the instructions of my Government, I have the honour to inform you of the further violations of the territorial integrity and sovereignty of Senegal committed by Portuguese elements:

1. On 7 October 1967, Portuguese aircraft flew over the M'Pack arrondissement, thus violating Senegalese air space.
2. During the night of 5/6 November 1967, Portuguese elements crossed the Senegalese border and threw two grenades into the village of Salikenie, wounding several members of the civilian population.
3. On 5 November 1967, Portuguese elements crossed the border in the Tanaff arrondissement and carried off a refugee from the village of Bissassoudouma, struck a woman and stole some money.

Portugal is responsible for this new violation of the territorial integrity of Senegal.

I should be grateful if you would inform the members of the Security Council of these new incidents and have this letter published as a Council document.
