LETTER DATED 12 MARCH 1968 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE REPUBLIC OF CHAD ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

COMMUNIQUE OF THE NATIONAL POLITICAL BUREAU CCNCEFNING THE CASE OF RHODESIA

The National Political Bureau was profoundly dismayed to learn of the murder It recalls that at the proper time, it had drawn the attention of three Rhodesians. of the world to the gravity of the situation in Rhodesia, a United Kingdom Territory, in which the genocide of a whole black population through its leaders is practised. The sanctions taken against the Ian Smith régime, already insufficient in themselves, have still not been applied to the letter. It is clear that the great Powers by their unavowed complicity assume the entire responsibility for the murder of the Rhodesian people. The West, the cradle of democracy, taught us that the minority, since its rights are protected, should submit to the decisions of the Is the minority régime in Salisbury not bound by this rule because it is a white régime in Africa? The National Political Bureau hopes that the independent nations of Africa have learned, at their cost, that the liberation of the continent will not be achieved with speeches. In the face of the growing slaughter of Rhodesian nationalists, the National Political Bureau urges the Organization of African Unity to form a more effective strategy which will quickly induce the great Powers to assume their responsibilities. The National Political Bureau is convinced that the Salisbury régime, despite the savage murders of Rhodesian leaders, will not remain in power indefinitely.
