NOTE VERBALE DATED 20 MARCH 1968 FROM THE CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I. OF SUDAN
TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Chargé d'Affaires a.i. of the Sudan to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and with reference to the Secretary-General's Note No. 230 SORH (1) of 20 March 1967, has the honour to append hereunder the text of a note by the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Sudan addressed to the Secretary-General of the United Nations:

"The Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Sudan presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and with reference to his Note No. PO 230 SORH (1) dated 13 January 1967 transmitting the text of resolution S/RES/232 (1966) adopted by the Security Council on 16 December 1966 has the honour to inform the Secretary-General that the Government of the Republic of the Sudan has, in accordance with its previously stated policy towards the illegal regime in Rhodesia, already enacted legislation prohibiting, throughout the territory of the Republic of the Sudan, all import and every manner of commercial transaction in goods originating in Southern Rhodesia, or the export of goods of Sudanese origin, to Southern Rhodesia. This prohibition includes goods in transit from a third State.

The full text of the Southern Rhodesia Boycott Act 1966 was transmitted to the Secretary-General vide Note No. UN/90 dated 14 October 1966 by the Permanent Representative of the Sudan to the United Nations and circulated as General Assembly document A/6479 and Security Council document S/7558.

The Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Sudan requests the Secretary-General to have the text of this Note circulated as a Security Council document and avails himself of this opportunity to renew to the Secretary-General of the United Nations the assurances of its highest consideration."
