LETTER DATED 19 JUNE 1967 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF CAMBODIA  
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On the instructions of my Government and further to my letter No. 3586 of 29 May 1967, I have the honour to inform you that during the morning of 28 May 1967, at about 10.15 a.m., a lorry travelling to Kok Khpos drove over a mine concealed by Thai elements at O-Kap Ches, approximately eleven kilometres west of the town of Samrong and some twenty kilometres from the frontier in the Khum of Kok Khpos, Srok of Samrong, province of Oddar Meanchey.

The explosion did the following damage:

personnel

- six dead and eleven injured (four seriously).

equipment

- lorry damaged.

The Royal Government of Cambodia has registered a strong and energetic protest against this criminal act committed in Khmer territory by Thai elements and demands that the Royal Government of Thailand should put an immediate end to all its acts of terrorism against Cambodian territory.

I should be grateful if you would have the text of this communication circulated as a Security Council document.
