LETTER DATED 16 MARCH 1967 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF NEW ZEALAND ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

In his message to you, contained in my letter of 23 December 1966, the Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs of New Zealand indicated that the terms of resolution 232 (1966) on Southern Rhodesia adopted by the Security Council on 16 December 1966 were being brought to the attention of the Government of the Cook Islands.

I now have the honour to advise you, on behalf of the Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs of New Zealand, that the Cook Islands Government has, in terms of the Cook Islands Constitution, formally requested and consented that the United Nations Sanctions (Southern Rhodesia) Regulations 1966 should be extended to the Cook Islands by the Government of New Zealand.

This request has now been complied with by means of the United Nations Sanctions (Southern Rhodesia) Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 1, issued by the New Zealand Government om 13 March 1967. As a result the New Zealand Government is able to advise that the Regulations implementing Security Council resolution 232 (1966) are in force and given effect to in the Cook Islands. Copies of the recent Regulations will be forwarded to you in the near future.

I should be glad if you would have this letter circulated as an official document of the Security Council.
