LETTER DATED 11 NOVEMBER 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE  
OF CAMBODIA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to bring the following to your attention for the information of the members of the Security Council.

On 29 September 1966, at about 2.30 p.m., two grenades planted by armed elements coming from Thai territory exploded in the village of Tasong, Khum of Kauk Romiet, Province of Battambang, a locality situated approximately 13 kilometres from the frontier and 37 kilometres north of Sisophon.

The explosion killed six oxen belonging to the inhabitants of the village and injured three others.

On 2 October 1966, at about 11.45 p.m., armed elements coming from Thai territory attacked with automatic weapons the Khmer military post of Khvao in the Khum of Svay Chek, Srok of Thmar Puok, Province of Battambang, a post situated approximately 11 kilometres from the frontier and some 30 kilometres north-west of the town of Sisophon.

On 8 October 1966, at about noon, two buffalo belonging to the inhabitants of the village of Daun Nauy, Srok of Thmar Puok, Province of Battambang set off a grenade planted by armed elements coming from Thai territory at a place situated approximately 15 kilometres from the frontier and approximately 10 kilometres south-west of the town of Thmar Puok.

The Royal Government of Cambodia has lodged a vigorous, solemn protest against these acts of aggression and provocation committed by armed elements coming from Thai territory, and it has called upon the Royal Government of Thailand to bring about their immediate cessation.

I should be grateful if you would have this communication circulated as a Security Council document.
