REPORT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE  
SITUATION IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Addendum

1. The following information on the withdrawal of the Inter-American Peace Force from the Dominican Republic has been received from the office of my Representative there since the publication of my last report on the subject (S/7338/Add.6) on 3 August 1966.
2. On 6 August, the office of my Representative was informed by IAPF headquarters that during the period from 3 to 5 August, 500 men of the 2nd Battalion of the 504th Infantry (Airborne) had been withdrawn from Dominican territory. The personnel left by air from San Isidro Air Base and the equipment by sea from the military port of Haina.
3. From 6 to 11 August, 597 men of the 1st Battalion of the 504 Infantry (Airborne) departed from the country.
4. On 11 August, twenty men of the 1st Platoon of the 17th Cavalry (Airborne), twenty-five men of Company C of the 307th Medical Battalion and eighteen men of Company A of the 307th Engineer Battalion were also withdrawn.
5. On the same day, a United States military ship left Haina with a full cargo of equipment and military vehicles, accompanied by twelve men.
6. On 12 August, 177 men of the Honduran contingent, 156 men of Company A of the 307th Engineer Battalion, fourteen officers and men of headquarters, 1st Brigade, 82nd Infantry (Airborne), and twenty-four men of the 219th Military Police Company left by air from San Isidro Base.
7. With the exception of the Honduran contingent, all units referred to above belong to the United States contingent of IAPF.
