REPORT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE SITUATION IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Addendum

1. The following information on the withdrawal of the Inter-American Peace Force from the Dominican Republic has been received from the office of my Representative there since the publication of my last report on the subject (S/7338/Add.7) on 12 August 1966.

2. As indicated in my report of 3 August 1966 (S/7338/Add.6), ten Costa Rican military police, representing one half of the Costa Rican contingent of IAPF, had departed from the Dominican Republic on 8 July. The remainder of the Costa Rican contingent, except for one man who has stayed behind to represent the contingent, was withdrawn from the country on 13 August.

3. The office of my Representative has been informed by IAPF headquarters of the withdrawal of the following United States troops and equipment:

(a) On 13 August, fifteen men of the 42nd Field Hospital, two officers and fifty-seven men of the 67th Maintenance Battalion, six men of the 218th Military Police Company, two men of the 524th Personnel Service and six men of the 546th Transport Company departed by ship. With the departure of this personnel the second phase of the scheduled withdrawal was completed.

(b) On 16 August, fifty-two men left by air from San Isidro Air Base.

(c) On 17 August, six men of the 69th Medical Detachment, one officer and twenty-two men of the 42nd Field Hospital, sixteen men of the 627th Supply and Service Battelion and eight men of the 649th Supply and Service Company were withdrawn by ship together with 110 military vehicles. On the same day, 103 men belonging to the above-mentioned units departed by air from San Isidro Air Base.

(d) On 18 August, twenty-four men left by air from San Isidro Air Base.

(e) On 19 August, fourteen men of the Task Force Special Forces Operation Group, twenty-four men of the 206th Signal Company, eight men of the 218th Military Police Company, five men of the 244th Psychological Operations, eight men of the 285th Engineer Detachment and five men of the 523rd Engineer Pattalion left by ship. One hundred and fifteen military vehicles were withdrawn on the same ship.
