LETTER DATED 14 FEBRUARY 1967 FROM THE DEPUTY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF YEMEN ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Upon instructions received from my Government, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that on 12 February 1967, at 12.45 p.m. local time, four British war-planes coming from the British military base in the Occupied Scuth Yemen have again, in a provocative manner, violated the Yemen Arab Republic air-space and flew over Jabal Mores (Mores Mountain) and Qatabah Post.

I would like to draw your attention once again to the fact that this act of aggression committed by the British military force constitutes the seventh in a row within six weeks. I need not repeat or emphasize that such acts of aggression do not contribute to peace and security in the region. On the contrary, they only breed violence and instability and constitute a gross violation of the United Nations Charter.

I should be grateful if Your Excellency would arrange for this letter to be circulated as a Security Council document.
