NOTE VERBALE DATED 30 MARCH 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF HUNGARY ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the Hungarian People's Republic to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and, with reference to his note No. PO 210 PORT (1) of 3 December 1965, has the honour to communicate the following:

The Government of the Hungarian People's Republic, in full conformity with its consistent anti-colonialist policy, has always refrained, and intends to do so in the future as well, from offering the Portuguese Government any assistance which would enable it to continue its repression of the people of the Territories under its administration. The competent Hungarian authorities have been duly authorized to continue to take all necessary measures to prevent the sale and supply of arms and military equipment to the Portuguese Government for any purpose, including the sale and shipment of equipment and materials for the manufacture and maintenance of arms and ammunition to be used in the Territories under Portuguese administration.

The Government of the Hungarian People's Republic hopes that a strict adherence to the provisions of Security Council resolution 218 (1965) by all Member States of the United Nations, particularly those having close relations with the Government of Portugal, will contribute to the attainment of independence, without further delay, of the peoples under Portuguese colonial administration.

The Permanent Representative of Hungary would be grateful if the Secretary-General would have this note circulated as a document of the Security Council and the General Assembly.
