The President of the Security Council has noted, with some surprise, the message transmitted to him by the Secretary-General on behalf of certain members of the Council.

Such a procedure is without precedent in the history of the Security Council. It has always been the prerogative of the President to call a meeting of the Security Council at the request of a member and after consultations with all the members to set a date and time convenient to them all.

The President of the Security Council has, therefore, followed the customary procedure by engaging in consultations with the members of the Security Council. At the present time, these consultations are still going on. Consequently, the President of the Security Council is not yet in a position to announce the date and time of the meeting of the Security Council.

He hopes to conclude these consultations on Friday and thereby be able to announce a time and date for the Security Council meeting.
