LETTER DATED 21 FEBRUARY 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF CANADA ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to refer to my note of 10 January 1966 concerning the measures taken by the Canadian Government following the unilateral declaration of independence in Southern Rhodesia. I now wish to inform you of further measures announced on 10 February 1966, which are also being taken pursuant to Security Council resolution 217 (1965) of 20 November 1965. I should point out that application of measures listed in my note of 10 January against Rhodesian imports already involved an embargo on 98 per cent of normal imports from Rhodesia.

A total embargo has now been placed on goods of Rhodesian origin. All exports from Canada to Rhodesia are also embargoed with certain limited exceptions. Consideration may however be given to applications to export food, medical supplies, other goods for humanitarian purposes and goods which are for the essential needs of the Rhodesian Railways, the Central African Airways and the Central African Power Corporation which are operated jointly by Zambia and Rhodesia.

I should be grateful if this letter could be circulated as an official document of the General Assembly and of the Security Council.
