LETTER DATED 12 SEPTEMBER 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF CAMBODIA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On the instructions of my Government, I have the honour to acquaint you, for the information of the members of the Security Council, with the following:

At approximately 6 p.m. on 21 July 1966 a unit of the Provincial Guard based at Ampil, while carrying out a border watch patrol, was blown up by a mine laid by Thai armed forces at a point about 1,000 metres from the frontier some ten kilometres north-west of Prasat Banteai-Chhmear, in the Province of Oddor Meanchey.

In this incident one of our Provincial Guards was seriously wounded and died while being evacuated.

At approximately 8.45 a.m. on 12 August 1966 a Khmer unit from Kalar, while carrying out a border watch patrol, was blown up by a mine laid by Thai armed forces at a point about 500 metres from the frontier and 700 metres west of the village of Kalar in the khun of Kauk Romiet, srok of Thmar Puok, Battambang Province.

In this incident one of our soldiers was killed and another seriously wounded.

I should be obliged if you would be good enough to have the text of this communication circulated as a Security Council document.
