LETTER DATED 19 MAY 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF PAKISTAN
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Upon instructions from my Government, I have the honour to convey to you the following breach of the Cease-Fire Agreement committed by the Indian Forces:

On 29 April 1966, at about 1700 hours, Indian troops fired two LMG bursts from point 3720, GRS 071597 on two unarmed civilians of village BATTAL (0559) who were grazing cattle and cutting grass in the vicinity of the Cease-Fire Line in SQ 0659. Due to this firing one of the civilians was killed and the other seriously injured. The dead body of the civilian was found amongst the bushes by the residents of the village, BATTAL, who brought it back to the village. Upon examination of the dead body by the Police and the Pakistan Army authorities, it was found that the deceased had received one LMG burst in his hip and a bullet injury on his arm.

The second civilian suffered a bullet injury in his feet and is now under treatment.

The United Nations Observers Team has been informed of the incident.

I shall be grateful if this communication is circulated as a Security Council document.
