NOTE VERBALE DATED 8 FEBRUARY 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF IRELAND ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Ireland to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to the Secretary-General's notes No. TR 300 SORH and PO 230 SORH (1), of 12 and 29 November 1965, respectively, transmitting texts of General Assembly resolution 2022 (XX) and Security Council resolution 217 (1965) regarding Southern Rhodesia, has the honour to state as follows:

The Salisbury régime has not been recognized by the Government of Ireland.

The following actions have been taken since the adoption of the above resolutions:

- (1) The export of arms, ammunition and military material to Southern Rhodesia is prohibited;
- (2) The export of petroleum and petroleum products to Southern Rhodesia is prohibited;
- (3) Exchange control regulations have been put into operation and all financial transactions with Southern Rhodesia are subject to control;
- (4) All imports from Southern Rhodesia have been subjected to control with a view to preventing the import of tobacco and asbestos which account for 98 per cent of normal imports;
- (5) Southern Rhodesia is excluded from the scheme of insurance for exporters against political risks.

It would be appreciated if this note were circulated as an official document of the General Assembly and of the Security Council.
