
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### Appointment of a member of the Joint Inspection Unit

### Note by the President of the General Assembly

- 1. As indicated in paragraph 3 of the note by the Secretary-General of 30 June 2003 (A/58/108), the General Assembly is required, during its current session, to appoint one member of the Joint Inspection Unit to fill the vacancy that will arise from the expiration on 31 December 2004 of the term of office of Sumihiro Kuyama.
- 2. In accordance with the procedures described in article 3, paragraph 1, of the statute of the Joint Inspection Unit, the President of the General Assembly, having held the necessary consultations, and on the basis of the candidate submitted by the Group of Asian States, requested Japan to propose a candidate (see annex I).
- 3. The President of the General Assembly has held the consultations described in article 3, paragraph 2, of the statute of the Joint Inspection Unit, including consultations with the President of the Economic and Social Council and with the Secretary-General in his capacity as Chairman of the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination. The replies received from the President of the Council and from the Secretary-General to identical letters addressed to them on 26 March 2004 by the President of the Assembly are annexed (see annexes II and III).
- 4. Having completed the required consultations, the President of the General Assembly has the honour to submit to the Assembly the following candidate for appointment as a member of the Joint Inspection Unit for a five-year term beginning on 1 January 2005 and expiring on 31 December 2009:

# Letter dated 24 March 2004 from the Permanent Representative of Japan to the United Nations addressed to the President of the General Assembly

At the 57th plenary meeting of the General Assembly, on 5 November 2003, it was decided that the Government of Japan would be invited to nominate a candidate for the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU) to serve for a period of five years beginning 1 January 2005. The Government of Japan accordingly would like to propose Ambassador Tadanori Inomata as the candidate for JIU, as we believe he is superbly qualified for the position in article 2, paragraph 1, of the JIU statute.
