

- * Legal, regulatory & administrative reforms



- High cost of logistics and procedures
- * Excessive delays
- Illegal practices and corruption
- Lack of predictability of delays and costs

Some Major Causes of trade barriers

- *Lack of clarity/transparency of procedures
- *Direct transactions with several employees
- *Numerous manual paperwork and many errors
- *Many control entities with different policies and procedures
- *Lack of coordination among various parties
- *An average of 40 steps and 20 signatures for import
- *Unclear standards for the valuation of goods
