LETTER DATED 28 SEPTEMBER 1966 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF CAMBODIA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On the instructions of my Government, I have the honour to communicate the following to you for the information of the members of the Security Council.

On 2 September 1966, at about 9 a.m., a group of Khmer military elements, while on patrol, set off two mines laid by intruders from Thai territory, three kilometres from the Cambodian post of Trapeang Tao, at a point situated some ten kilometres from the frontier and some forty kilometres north-east of Samrong, Oddor Meanchey Province.

One Khmer major and one soldier were killed and another soldier was seriously wounded.

The Royal Government has made a vigorous and formal protest against this deliberate laying of mines in Khmer territory by intruders from Thai territory, which has caused a loss of human life, and it has demanded that the Royal Government of Thailand should take measures for the immediate cessation of such criminal acts.

I should be grateful if you would have the text of this communication circulated as a Security Council document.
