E 263: Tallinn - Tartu - Luhamaa

Justification

The road is a connecting link between two major Estonian towns, Tallinn and Tartu. It is part of the Trans-European Transport Network (TEN) and ends at the road E 77 from Riga to Pskov.

Tallinn - Tartu - Luhamaa is a main road in the Republic of Estonia and has been given the number 2 in the registry of state roads. It starts at the meeting point of two roads, E 20 and E 67, in the zero point of Tallinn.

The total length of the road is 282.432 km. This includes a 20.142 km section of class I road with 4 lanes. The rest of the road, 262,290 km, is a class III road with a width of 9m. Average traffic volume is almost 13,000 vehicles per day. There are bypasses around Tartu and Võru.
