Military training includes duties and responsibilities of military personnel to comply with the provisions of this Protocol.

Mine clearance programmes

Any mine fields have not been on the territory of the Czech Republic since October 15, 2002. Therefore none mine clearance program was considered.

The Partial Pyrotechnic Sanitation (PPS) in MLADA and RALSKO, the former military zones, has been carried out since September 1993 according to the Government resolutions numbers-348/1992, 140/1993, 350/1997 and 95/2003. PPS in MLADA has been already finished in June 2000 and in RALSKO is to be fulfilled by the end of November 2003.

Based on our experience, PPS can be characterised as a process of search, detection and destruction of ammunition and elements of ammunition in the target and endangered areas of the former fire ranges, and remains of ammunition left or dumped in ammunition dumps, buildings or open terrain. A UXO from Austria-Hungarian period, from the Czechoslovakian period, from the period of the German occupation during the World War II, and UXO of the Soviet Army, which was based there till 1989, could be found there.

International technical information exchange

The Czech Republic had prepared and used a technology for destruction of the antipersonnel bounding/fragmentation mines PP Mi-Šr II. The equipment used for dismantling/strip down operations consists of simple tools for disassembling and auxiliary fixtures mounted on benches or fixed to floor. A single purpose, automatically working electric equipment is used in one operation only. The equipment is operated without from the armoured box.

International cooperation on mine clearance

Czech KFOR (FRY – Kosovo) units are engaged in mine clearance in their areas of responsibility.

International co-operation on technical co-operation and assistance

The Czech Republic has been supporting the International Trust Fund of the Republic of Slovenia for Demining and Mine Victims Assistance in Bosnia and Herzegovina and FRY-Kosovo.

Means and technologies of mine clearance

The Czech Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) teams in KFOR are equipped with the "LOCUST 750" BOZENA, an universal loader (made in Slovakia), remotely controlled and equipped with rotating flails to destroy/activate mines and UXO.

Handheld equipment and other common conventional demining means are also used in the Czech Army.
