II. Annotations to the provisional agenda

Item 1: Election of officers

1. It is recommended that the Expert Meeting elect a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson-cum-Rapporteur.

Item 2: Adoption of the agenda and organization of work

2. The provisional agenda for the Expert Meeting is reproduced in section I above. The Expert Meeting will have three days, from 24 to 26 November 2004, to complete its work. Item 3: Design and implementation of transit transport arrangements

- 3. The Commission on Enterprise, Business Facilitation and Development decided to convene an Intergovernmental Expert Group Meeting on the Design and Implementation of Transit Transport Arrangements.
- 4. Countries that depend on transit trade, i.e. notably landlocked countries, are confronted with a variety of practical constraints that increase the logistics costs of their international trade. Specific constraints are related to Customs and border procedures and also to the fact that cargo and transport services have to adapt to different sets of administrative, legal, commercial and other conditions when passing through a third country. Transit arrangements that aim at diminishing these constraints need to take new developments into account, notably concerning trade facilitation, new technologies, multimodal transport and transport security. In order to develop and implement specific transit arrangements, the public and private sectors of the transit country and of the land-locked country need to cooperate within each country, as well as between the two countries, through appropriate national and regional coordination mechanisms. In many cases, corridor-specific arrangements can be found that lead to win-win situations, where both countries can benefit from synergies and economies of scale in investments and transport operations.
- 5. The Expert Meeting will review the practical constraints faced by transit transport operations. It will further review the impact of recent developments in transport and logistics that have a bearing on transit trade, including trade facilitation, new technologies, multimodal transport and transport security. Finally, it will explore ways and means to cooperate in the design and implementation of transit transport arrangements.

6. To facilitate the discussions, the UNCTAD secretariat has prepared an issues note on recent developments in multimodal transport and logistic services, and problems encountered by developing countries (TD/B/COM.3/EM.22/2). In addition, experts are encouraged to prepare brief papers on the subject under discussion. These papers will be made available at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received.
