## Paragraph 39, page 13

In the twelfth sentence, after That was the approach taken add by the Holy See in the recommendations - virtually a code of ethics - on tourism drafted by it over several years (see the address of the Supreme Pontiff to the Second World Congress for the Pastorate of Tourism, the episcopal documents issued by the Pontifical Commission on Migration and Tourism and the general guidelines for the pastorate of tourism, issued at Rome on 30 April 1969), while at the same time it continued to encourage the religious orders which are specially dedicated to the rescue of persons engaged in prostitution. ## Page 36

After paragraph 103 add the following new paragraph:

As a result of the Asian Consultation at Manila in March 1982 (cited in Annex VI), women representing 24 countries from all continents set up at Rotterdam, on 16 April 1983, an International Feminist Network against Traffic in Women and Female Sexual Slavery. This informal co-ordinating body intends, by organizing regional meetings, to inform and educate the public on various forms of sexual violence, to press for improvements in existing legislation and co-operation with international institutions and to combat anything that serves to institutionalize sexual slavery, including the organization and exploitation of prostitution.
