LETTER DATED 30 NOVEMBER 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF INDIA
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to communicate the following further cease-fire violations and other incidents created by Pakistan:

Jammu and Kashmir

Keran Sector

1. Pakistani troops fired towards our posts as under on 23/24 November 1965:
 - (a) Two posts in an area ten and fifteen miles east-north-east of Keran.
 - (b) One post in an area twelve miles west-south-west of Ring Pain.

Kargil Sector

2. Pakistani troops fired small arms from an area fifteen and a half miles north-east of Kargil.

3. Eight Pakistani troops were observed improving defences in an area four and a half miles north-north-east of Kargil on 26 November 1965.

Tithwal Sector

4. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers at three places in an area four miles west-south-west to five miles south-west of Tithwal on 24 November 1965 and fired medium machine-gun and 81 mm mortars towards our troops at five places in an area eight and a half miles north-north-east of Tithwal on 24 November 1965.

5. Pakistani troops were observed digging in the area five miles south-west of Tithwal on 25 November 1965.

Uri Sector

6. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in areas approximately two and a half miles east and south of Chakothi on 25 November 1965 and seven miles south-south-west of Haji Pir Pass on 24 November 1965.

7. Pakistani troops were observed digging in the following areas on 25 November 1965:

(a) Eight and a half miles west of Uri.

(b) Three and a half miles and six and a half miles south-south-west of Haji Pir.

8. One hundred loaded mules and fifty Pakistani troops were seen moving towards an area six miles south-west of Haji Pir Pass on 26 November 1965.

9. Pakistani troops were seen digging in areas seven miles south-south-west and five miles south of Haji Pir on 26 and 27 November 1965.

10. Sixty Pakistani troops were seen moving towards Chakothi ten miles west-north-west of Uri on 27 November 1965.

Punch Sector

11. Sixty Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area four and three quarter miles west-north-west and they also fired medium machine-gun towards our area, three and a half miles west-north-west of Punch, on 24 November 1965.

12. Pakistani troops were seen digging in general area five miles north-west of Punch on 25 November 1965.

13. Pakistani troops fired with medium machine-guns on our post in an area three and a half miles north-west of Punch on 25 November 1965.

14. Pakistani troops directed medium machine-gun fire towards our post in an area four miles west of Punch on 26 November 1965.

15. Twenty Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area five miles north-west of Punch on 26 November 1965.

Mendhar Sector

16. Pakistani troops fired as under on 23 November 1965:

(a) 25-Pounders towards an area six miles west-south-west of Galuthi.

(b) 3.7-inch Howitzers towards three posts in general area, four miles south-south-east of Mendhar.

(c) 81 mm mortars towards two posts in general area four miles west-south-west of Mendhar.

17. Pakistani troops fired 3.7-inch Howitzers, 81 mm mortars and Browning machine-guns towards our posts in areas three and five miles west of Mendhar,

six miles west and four and three-quarter miles west-south-west of Galuthi on 24 November 1965.

18. Two Pakistani troops fired from an area five and a half miles west-south-west of Galuthi on 24 November 1965.

19. Pakistani troops fired as under on 25/26 November 1965:

(a) 3.7-inch Howitzer on our post in an area five miles west of Galuthi.

(b) Medium machine-guns on our picket in an area three and a half miles south-west of Galuthi.

(c) 81 mm mortar and 3.7-inch Howitzer/25-pounder on picket in an area six miles west of Mendhar.

20. Twenty Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area eleven miles west of Mendhar on 26 November 1965.

21. Pakistani troops directed medium machine-gun mortar and artillery fire towards our four posts in an area five miles west-north-west to five miles south-south-east of Mendhar on 27 November 1965.

Naushahra Sector

22. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area seven miles south-south-west of Naushahra and fired towards our area two miles north-west of Jhangar on 25 November 1965.

23. Pakistani troops shelled seven of our posts in Jhangar area on 26 November 1965.

Akhnur Sector

24. Pakistani troops were seen digging at three places in an area six to seven miles east-south-east and approximately two miles south-south-west of Kalidhar and constructing bunkers seven and a quarter miles west-north-west of Akhnur on 24 and 25 November 1965.

25. Pakistani troops were observed digging in the following areas on 26 November 1965:

(a) Six miles east-south-east of Kalidhar.

(b) Five miles north-east and three and a half miles north-west of Jaurian.

(c) Six and a half miles north-north-west of Dewa.

26. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in areas four miles west and five miles east-south-east of Balwinder Bridge on 27 November 1965.

Sialkot Sector

27. Pakistani troops fired three bursts of medium machine-gun on our post in an area two miles south-west of Pagowal at 1145 hours on 24 November 1965.

28. Pakistani troops fired with small arms on our patrol moving in an area four and a half miles west-north-west of Phillora at 1630 hours on 24 November 1965.

29. Pakistani troops fired with small arms on our post and on an observation post in an area four miles west-north-west and three and a half miles west of Phillora, respectively, on 24 November 1965.

30. Pakistani troops were seen digging at three places in an area between three and a half miles west-north-west and south-south-west of Suchetgarh on 25 November 1965 and at two places, three and three-quarter miles west-north-west and three and a half miles south of Pagowal on the night of 24/25 November 1965 and 25 November 1965 respectively.

31. Pakistani troops fired light machine-guns at our observation post and at our troops in areas four miles west-north-west and four and a half miles south-east of Phillora on 25 November 1965.

32. Pakistani troops were observed digging in an area two and a half miles west-south-west of Phillora on 25 November 1965.

33. Four Pakistani troops were observed in the previously unoccupied trenches in area three miles west-south-west of Suchetgarh on 26 November 1965.

34. Fresh digging by the Pakistani troops was observed in an area three and a half miles west-north-west of Suchetgarh on 26 November 1965.

Lahore Sector

35. Pakistani troops fired with small arms on our police patrol in an area nine miles west of Dera Baba Nanak between 1240 and 1315 hours on 23 November 1965.

36. Pakistani troops fired with small arms towards our post in an area five miles west-south-west of Mandot on 23 November 1965.

37. Pakistani troops fired 25-pounders, 3.5-inch Rocket Launcher, 60 and 81 mm mortars towards an area four miles south-south-west of Barki on the night of 23/24 November and 24 November 1965.

38. Pakistani troops were observed digging at three places in an area between two miles north and five and a half miles south of Dograi on 23 November and the night of 23/24 November 1965.

39. Pakistani troops fired 3.5-inch Rockets towards an area one mile south-south-west of Barki on 24 November 1965.
40. Pakistani troops fired one light machine-gun burst on our post three and a half miles north-west of Mandot, on 24 November 1965.
41. Pakistani troops fired small arms and medium machine-gun towards our troops in an area south of Barki on the night of 24/25 November 1965.
42. Pakistani troops fired small arms, Browning machine-guns and 2-inch mortars intermittently towards our troops in Dograi area, three times on 24 November and once on 25 November 1965.
43. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers and digging at six places in an area between Bhasin and Dograi on 24 and 25 November 1965.
44. Pakistani troops fired intermittently, light machine-gun bursts from an area one and a half miles south-south-west of Bhasin on 25 November 1965.
45. Pakistani troops carried out digging in an area two miles south-south-west of Barki. They were also seen digging trenches and unloading defence stores in an area 800 yards west-north-west of Barki on 25 November 1965.
46. Pakistani troops were seen digging and unloading defence stores in areas seven and five and a half miles north-north-west of Khem Karan, respectively, on 25 November 1965.
47. Pakistani troops fired on five occasions and were seen digging bunkers and strengthening defences in an area between Dograi and nine miles north of it on 25 November 1965 and 26 November 1965.
48. Pakistani troops fired on three occasions and were also observed digging trenches and bringing defence stores in an area between 900 yards west-north-west and five miles south of Barki on 25 and 26 November 1965.
49. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our posts in areas three miles north-north-west of Khemkaran on 26 and 27 November 1965.
50. Pakistani troops were seen digging and improving defences in areas one mile south-south-west of Bhasin, half a mile south-west of Dogaich, two miles south-east of Jallo and one mile south-south-west of Barki on 26 and 27 November 1965.
51. Pakistani two one-ton vehicles unloaded ammunition in an area on the west bank of Ichhogil canal, three miles south-south-west of Barki on 27 November 1965.
52. Pakistani troops directed small arms and mortar fire towards our posts in an area three miles south-south-west of Barki on 27 and 28 November 1965.

53. Pakistani troops fired rifle shots and Verey light towards our posts in an area half a mile north-east of Bhasin and area Dograi on 27 and 28 November 1965.

54. A Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew over the west bank of Ichhogil Canal opposite Jhaman on 27 November 1965.

Fazilka Sector

55. Pakistani troops were observed digging at two places in areas six miles south-west and four miles west of Fazilka on 23 November 1965.

56. Pakistani troops established a new observation post and were seen improving defences in general area of Chananwala, approximately six miles south-west of Fazilka on 24 and 25 November 1965.

57. One Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew over SM 2357 and SM 2457 at 1606 hours on 21 November 1965 and back to SM 2057.

58. Two Pakistani F 86 aircraft flew over SG 8139 north-east south-west at 1545 hours on 22 November 1965.

59. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our three posts along the border in an area nine miles north-east, two and a half and four miles north-north-east of Ferozepore Headworks on 24 and 25 November 1965.

60. Pakistani troops fired small arms, 2-inch mortars and medium machine-guns towards our troops in an area one and a half miles south-west of Rajoke on 25 November 1965.

61. Pakistani air observation aircraft flew over Chananwala, Pakka and Muzzim areas on 25 November 1965.

62. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our four posts in areas three and a half miles north-north-west to five miles west-south-west of Wardot on 24 and 25 November 1965.

63. Pakistani troops fired twice on our positions and were seen constructing bunkers in general area of Chananwala on 25 November 1965.

64. Pakistani troops fired with small arms automatic weapons and mortars on our positions in general area two miles north-west of Hussainiwala on the night of 25/26 and 27 November 1965.

65. Pakistani troops started digging in an area seventy yards in front of our forward defended localities, two miles north-west of Hussainiwala at 1445 hours on 27 November 1965. On being warned to stop digging, they fired a burst at our

Platoon Commander. They again opened up with RCL guns and some tanks started moving nearby.

66. Pakistani troops fired two light machine-gun bursts from Ratoke area on 28 November 1965.

Rajasthan

67. Pakistani troops constructed two section posts in general area Viriario, approximately ten miles south of Gadra city at 1750 hours on 23 November 1965.

86. Pakistani troops established a new observation post in an area approximately five miles south-west of Munabao on 24 November 1965.

69. A Pakistani patrol of approximately two platoons with 3-inch mortar fired at our patrol in an area three miles south-west of Sadhewala from 1700 hours to 2000 hours on 25 November 1965.

70. Pakistani artillery shelled Nuriala, eight miles south-south-east of Miajlar at 2000 hours on 25 November 1965. Intense shelling started again from 0400 hours to 0700 hours on 26 November 1965. They also shelled an area point 473, four miles south-west of Miajlar on 26 November 1965.

71. Pakistani troops fired at our troops in an area twenty-four miles south-west of Chohtan on the night of 24/25 November 1965.

72. Pakistani patrol fired rifle grenades and light machine-gun on our listening post in Munabao area on the night of 25/26 November 1965. Another listening post in the same area was also fired upon by few armed Pakistanis.

73. Our screen position in an area four miles south-west of Miajlar was attacked by two platoons of Pakistani troops supported by artillery at 0800 hours on 26 November 1965.

74. Pakistani troops fired on our patrol with small arms and 3-inch mortar in an area three miles south of Pochhina at 1300 hours on 26 November 1965.

75. Pakistani troops directed small arms and mortar fire towards our patrols in an area forty-four miles north-west of Gadra Road and twenty-eight miles west-south-west of Ramgarh on 26 November 1965.

76. A Pakistani patrol approximately a platoon strong was seen coming from Achhchri Tibba four miles north-west of Tanot and opened fire at our post on 27 November 1965. On being warned by our troops they withdrew.

77. Pakistani troops fired at our position from their observation post at point 467, thirty-six miles north-north-west of Gadra Road on 26 November 1965.

78. Pakistani troops, approximately one platoon, tried to attack our post at point 473, four miles south-west of Miajlar on 27 November 1965. They ran back towards Sundra on being warned by our troops.

79. A Pakistani patrol moving from Ghotaru to Bopat Tibba, twenty-eight miles west of Ramgarh, fired at our patrol on 28 November 1965.

80. A Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew from Kishangarh direction, over Tanot and Ghantiala Mandir on 26 November 1965.

81. A Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew over Tanot on 26 November 1965.

82. A Pakistani aircraft flew over Karara approximately five miles north of Pochhina at 1140 hours on 26 November 1965.

83. A Pakistani light aircraft flew over Sadhewala twenty-four miles north-west of Ramgarh, on 27 November 1965.

Cease-fire violation complaints have been or are being lodged in respect of all these violations.

I shall be grateful if this communication is circulated as a Security Council document.
