LETTER DATED 2 DECEMBER 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF PAKISTAN
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have been instructed by my Government to inform you of the following violations of the cease-fire by Indian forces:

- (1) An Indian observation aircraft flew over our positions in Village Jamite-Da-Wara SQ 7408 from 0900 hours to 0910 hours on 10 November 1965.
- (2) Indian soldiers started fresh digging in area GR 736139 at 1500 hours on 10 November 1965.
- (3) Indian troops fired two machine-gun bursts on our positions across the BRB Canal at GR 753914 at 1200 hours on 10 November 1965.
- (4) An Indian reconnaissance aircraft crossed the International Frontier and circled over Rinalh We 2688 between 0820 hours and 0827 hours on 10 November 1965.
- (5) Indian troops opened anti-aircraft fire from GR 849594 and .50 machine-gun fire from SQ 8559 and GR 844591 on our aircraft flying within our area at 1645 hours on 10 November 1965.
- (6) Indian soldiers came to the east bank of the BRB Canal at GR 753919 at 1045 hours on 11 November 1965 and started fresh digging. They were warned by our troops to desist from digging new trenches. The Indian soldiers continued digging for some time and then withdrew behind cover. Immediately afterwards they fired two machine-gun bursts on our positions.
- (7) An Indian army column started advancing from Sadhewala towards Sandh on the morning of 13 November 1965.
- (8) Indian troops fired with rifles, light machine-guns, machine-guns and 2" mortars simultaneously on our screens at GR 802617, GR 804613, GR 810649, GR 815603, GR 819599, GR 821596, GR 826597 and GR 832596 between 1945 hours and 2045 hours on 14 November 1965. An Indian tank also fired two rounds at our screens from GR 834600. Approximately one platoon of Indian soldiers crossed the line of control and came within forty yards of our screen at GR 818598.

(9) Indian troops fired with automatic weapons and small arms on our positions in SQ 2665 from GR 269651 and GR 269655 at 1030 hours on 15 November 1965.

(10) Indian troops fired with small arms from GR 260568 on our position in SQ 2556 at 1300 hours on 15 November 1965.

(11) An Indian observation aircraft flew over our forward lines in Janman area at 1050 hours on 15 November 1965.

(12) Indian troops were observed digging fresh trenches in area GR 768847 at 0730 hours on 15 November 1965.

(13) Two sections of Indian soldiers were observed laying mines and barbed wire in area 40K QB 2852 from 1600 hours to nightfall on 16 November 1965.

(14) Indian soldiers were observed digging fresh trenches in area GR 824642 about fifteen yards ahead of their original position at 0900 hours on 16 November 1965.

(15) Indian troops fired five rifle shots from GR 850443 at our positions in GR 856454 at 1330 hours on 16 November 1965.

(16) Indian troops simultaneously attacked Ghotaru and Sadhewala supported by artillery, mortars and machine-guns at 0100 hours on 16 November 1965. The United Nations Observers failed to restrain the Indians from committing this most serious violation of the cease-fire. At 0600 hours Indian troops intensified their attack on Sadhewala and directed heavy fire with mortars, medium machine-guns and six-pounder anti-tank guns on this position.

(17) Indian troops fired two rifle shots from Rajoke post at our position GR 838447 at 1615 hours on 17 November 1965.

(18) Indian troops fired with small arms and automatic weapons from GR 779761 on our positions at 0445 hours on 17 November 1965.

(19) Indian troops fired one burst with automatic weapons from area GR 778828 on our position in area GR 769824 at 1400 hours on 17 November 1965.

(20) Indian troops fired one machine-gun burst from area GR 780826 on our position on the far bank of the BRB Canal at 1645 hours on 17 November 1965.

(21) Indian troops laid new mines in area GR 788303 during the night of 17 and 18 November 1965.

(22) Indian troops fired with small arms from area 795740 on our position opposite this area at 0840 hours on 17 November 1965.

(23) Indian troops attacked Miajlar 40J LU 0536 at 0405 hours on 18 November 1965.

(24) Indian troops crept forward and occupied ridges in area 40J 2V 9926 and LW 0425 well within our line of control on 18 November 1965.

(25) Indian troops opened fire with light machine-guns on villagers in Somara 40K QB 5893 at 1030 hours on 18 November 1965.

(26) Indian troops were observed digging opposite Villages Arbaliar 40K QB 5799 and Somara on 18 November 1965.

(27) An Indian light reconnaissance aircraft flew across the line of actual control in area Biarani 40K QB 2853 and Jessa Ke Par 40K QB 2844 at 0800 hours on 18 November 1965.

(28) An Indian patrol came to GR 285718 and fired with arms on our position in SQ 2871 at 1100 hours on 19 November 1965.

(29) According to reports received on 20 November 1965, Indian forces increased their strength at Surupka Tala 40K QB 5606 and Janpalia 40K QB 6489.

(30) Indian troops opened fire with small arms from area Intikan 40K QB 1760 at 0440 hours on 21 November 1965.

(31) About two sections of Indian soldiers took position at 40K QA 9779 at 1600 hours on 21 November 1965.

(32) Approximately one platoon of Indian soldiers took position at ridge QA 9879 at 1150 hours on 21 November 1965.

All the above violations have been reported to UNIPOM.

I shall be grateful if this letter is circulated as a Security Council document.
