## **Report of the Conference on Disarmament**

The General Assembly,

Having considered the report of the Conference on Disarmament,<sup>1</sup>

*Convinced* that the Conference on Disarmament, as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum of the international community, has the primary role in substantive negotiations on priority questions of disarmament,

*Recognizing* the need to conduct multilateral negotiations with the aim of reaching agreement on concrete issues,

*Recalling*, in this respect, that the Conference has a number of urgent and important issues for negotiation,

*Taking note* of active discussions held on the programme of work during the 2004 session of the Conference, as duly reflected in the report and the records of the plenary meetings,

*Taking note also* of significant contributions made during the 2004 session to promote substantive discussions on issues on the agenda in the plenary meetings, as well as of discussions held on other issues that could also be relevant to the current international security environment,

*Stressing* the urgent need for the Conference to commence its substantive work at the beginning of its 2005 session,

*Expressing appreciation* for the convening of informal plenary meetings on its agenda, programme of work, organization and procedures, as well as on specific items of its agenda and other matters, referred to in section III, subsection H, of the

report of the Conference, which were held with a view to facilitating efforts to reach an agreement on a programme of work and beginning its substantive work as soon as possible,

*Taking note* of the decision reached on 12 February 2004 with regard to enhancement of the engagement of the civil society in the work of the Conference and the Presidential statement made thereafter,

1. *Reaffirms* the role of the Conference on Disarmament as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum of the international community;

2. Urges the Conference to fulfil that role in the light of the evolving international situation, with a view to making early substantive progress on priority items on its agenda;

3. *Calls upon* the Conference to intensify efforts further in conducting consultations and in exploring possibilities with a view to reaching an agreement on a programme of work;

4. *Takes note* of the strong collective interest of the Conference in commencing substantive work as soon as possible during its 2005 session;

5. Welcomes the decision of the Conference to request its current President and the incoming President to conduct consultations during the intersessional period and, if possible, to make recommendations, taking into account all relevant proposals, including those submitted as the documents of the Conference, views presented and discussions held, and to endeavour to keep the membership of the Conference informed, as appropriate, of their consultations, as expressed in paragraph 46 of its report;<sup>1</sup>

6. *Requests* all States members of the Conference to cooperate with the current President and successive Presidents in their efforts to guide the Conference to the early commencement of substantive work in its 2005 session;

7. *Requests* the Secretary-General to continue to ensure the provision to the Conference of adequate administrative, substantive and conference support services;

8. *Requests* the Conference to submit a report on its work to the General Assembly at its sixtieth session;

9. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its sixtieth session the item entitled "Report of the Conference on Disarmament".
