LETTER DATED 29 OCTOBER 1965 FROM THE ACTING PERMANENT REFRESENTATIVE OF THAILAND ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to the letter dated 16 September 1965 from the Charge d'Affaires, a.i. of Cambodia addressed to the President of the Security Council and circulated as Security Council document S/6689.

I have been instructed by my Government to bring to your notice, for the information of the members of the Security Council, that upon receipt of the Cambodian charge the Thai authorities of all the provinces along the entire Thai-Cambodian frontier have conducted careful and thorough investigations into the alleged incident which firmly establish that there had been no armed elements from Thailand entering Cambodian territory. Since whatever incidents alleged to occur inside Cambodia did not originate from the Thai side of the border, the Thai Government, therefore, could neither be expected to have any knowledge of the event nor held responsible for the alleged incident which took place solely within the Cambodian territory.

In this connexion, the Government of Thailand categorically rejects as totally unfounded and false the Cambodian charges contained in the above-mentioned letter.

I should be obliged if you would have the text of this letter circulated as an official document of the Security Council.
