LETTER DATED 12 NOVEMBER 1965 FROM THE DEPUTY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF UGANDA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have been directed to forward to you the following statement made by the Prime Minister of Uganda, the Hon. Dr. A.M. Obote, M.P., at Parliamentary Euilding on Thursday, 11 November 1965:

"The statement made this afternoon in Salisbury by Ian Smith, purporting to proclaim Rhodesia unilaterally independent does not alter the position and views of the Government of Uganda that Rhodesia is still a British colony. We have therefore sent the following message to the British Prime Minister: 'Uganda welcomes the action taken by Governor Sir Humphrey Gibbs in dismissing the rebellious Rhodesian Government led by Ian Smith. Uganda urges that the British Government and Parliament now take such measures that will ensure the success of the Governor's action. Uganda regards Rhodesia as still a British Colony and will therefore support stern measures to quell the rebellion.' Uganda will also expect the British Government and Parliament to have a physical presence in Rhodesia not only to back up the Governor's action in his direct administration but also to protect the lives of loyal Rhodesians."

Would you please circulate the statement as a Council document. Accept, Sir, etc.
