LETTER DATED 6 OCTOBER 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF PAKISTAN
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to inform you of the following further serious violations of the cease-fire by Indian forces:

(i) In utter disregard of the message sent by UNMOGIP on 3 October to the local commanders of both the sides in the Akhmar Sector to cease fire from 2030 hours on 3 October 1965, which was accepted by the Pakistani local commander, the Indian forces commenced artillery shelling on Bhudi Dhak at 2230 hours on the same day and from 0410 hours on 4 October. The shelling was followed by an attack in approximately brigade strength on Bhudi Dhak and area 585795.

(ii) The Indian forces are digging and building bunkers both by day and night on the Kohail distributory and the far bank of the RRB Canal, ever since they moved forward in this area, in spite of repeated reminders that their presence in the area was a violation of the cease-fire and despite the fact that the United Nations Observers twice visited the area and declared these actions to be flagrant violations of the cease-fire by the Indian forces. The Indian forces have now commenced digging on the forward edge of the far bank of the RRB Canal as well. UNIPOM has been requested to immediately take measures not only to stop further digging in the area by the Indians but also to force them to return to their pre-cessce-fire positions.

I shall be grateful if this letter is circulated as a Security Council document. Please accept, Excellency, the assurances of my highest consideration.
