LETTER DATED 6 OCTOBER 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF PAKISTAN
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have been instructed by my Government to inform you in continuation of my letter of 2 October 1965, regarding the acts of barbarity being committed by the Indian military authorities against the Pakistani prisoners-of-war that the documents and diaries captured by the Pakistan Forces reveal that the Indians are violating the Geneva Convention on the Treatment of Prisoners-of-War. Wounded Pakistani prisoners-of-war have not been given medical treatment and some have been tortured and killed in the Rajasthan and Fazilka Sectors. UNIPOM has been informed.

2. The Government of Pakistan requests the Secretary-General to persuade the Indians to abide by the Geneva Convention and accord humane treatment to the prisoners-of-war.

I shall be grateful if this letter is circulated as a Security Council document.
