

Benin, Libyan Arab Republic and Mauritius: draft resolution

The Security Council,

Considering that the cessation of foreign investment in South Africa and other measures to discourage economic co-operation with South Africa would be an important step in dissuading the South African racist régime from pursuing its abhorrent policy of apartheid,

Taking note of resolution 31/6 K adopted by the General Assembly on 9 November 1976.

- 1. Calls upon all Governments:
- (a) To refrain from any investments in, or loans to, the South African racist régime or companies registered in South Africa;
- (b) To take all appropriate steps to ensure that companies and financial institutions within their jurisdiction cease all further investments in, or loans to, the South African racist régime or companies registered in South Africa;
- (c) To refrain from any agreements or measures to promote trade or other economic relations with South Africa;
- 2. <u>Further calls upon</u> all the specialized agencies and other international institutions of the United Nations to refrain from any loans, credits or assistance to the South African racist régime or companies registered in South Africa;
- 3. Requests all States Members of the United Nations or of the specialized agencies to report to the Secretary-General by 31 July 1977 on measures taken to implement the present resolution;
- 4. Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the progress of the implementation of this resolution, the first report to be made not later than 31 August 1977;
- 5. <u>Decides</u> to maintain this item on its agenda for further action as appropriate in the light of developments.
