LETTER DATED 15 OCTOBER 1964 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF CAMBODIA
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

By order of the Royal Government of Cambodia, I have the honour to bring the following to your notice, for the information of the members of the Security Council:

"On 13 October 1964, at approximately 5.20 p.m., three Sky Raider aircraft of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Viet-Nam intruded more than four kilometres into Cambodian air space in the Trapeang Skoun region, south of Romeas Hek, province of Svay Rieng.

"After having circled this region several times, the South Viet-Namese aircraft made a machine-gun and rocket attack on the village of the area, where in the rice fields after their withdrawal, were found some thirty rocket holes and two bomb craters from ten to twelve metres in diameter and approximately two to three metres in depth. These same aggressive aircraft continued their attack in two other areas, Prey Koam and Chamcar Kaun Koki, leaving two bomb craters similar in size to the first.

"Crop damage was sustained as a result of the action of the bombs and rockets."

I should be obliged if you would have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
