Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

During the week ending 25 December 2004, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in Liberia (*see* S/22110/Add.3 and Corr.1; S/23370/Add.18 and 46; S/25070/Add.12, 23, 32 and 38; S/1994/20/Add.15, 20, 27, 36 and 41; S/1995/40/Add.1, 14, 25, 36 and 44; S/1996/15/Add.3, 4, 14, 18, 21, 34 and 47; S/1997/40/Add.12, 25 and 30; S/2001/15/Add.10 and 45; S/2002/30/Add.8, 18 and 49; S/2003/40/Add.4, 18, 30, 34, 37 and 51; and S/2004/20/Add.10, 22, 24 and 37; *see also* S/2001/15/Add.7 and 10; S/2003/40/Add.4, 11 and 37; and S/2004/20/Add.37)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5105th meeting, held on 21 December 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it letters dated 23 September 2004 and 6 December 2004, respectively, from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1521 (2003) concerning Liberia addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2004/752 and S/2004/955).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Liberia, at her request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/981) submitted by France, Germany, Romania, Spain, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/981, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1579 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1579 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

Briefings by Chairmen of Security Council committees and working groups (*see* S/2003/40/Add.51; *see also* S/2002/30/Add.50)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5106th meeting, held on 22 December 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Ismael Abraão Gaspar Martins, Chairman of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Conflict Prevention and Resolution in Africa; Heraldo Muñoz, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities; Munir Akram, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1521 (2003) concerning Liberia; and Gunter Pleuger, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1572 (2004) concerning Côte d'Ivoire.

The situation in Guinea-Bissau (*see* S/1998/44/Add.44 and 51; S/1999/25/Add.13; S/2000/40/Add.12 and 47; S/2002/30/Add.27; S/2003/40/Add.24, 39 and 46; and S/2004/20/Add.24 and 44)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5107th meeting, held on 22 December 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on developments in Guinea-Bissau and on the activities of the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in that country (S/2004/969).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Guinea-Bissau, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/986) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/986, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1580 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1580 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).
