**Security Council Committee established pursuant to
resolution 1572 (2004) concerning Côte d'Ivoire****Note verbale dated 3 March 2005 from the Permanent Mission of
Senegal to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of
the Committee**

The Permanent Mission of Senegal to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1572 (2004) concerning Côte d'Ivoire and, in response to his note verbale of 17 December 2004 and pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 15 of resolution 1572 (2004) concerning the implementation of the measures imposed by paragraphs 7, 9 and 11 of the said resolution, has the honour to state the following:

The Government of Senegal has taken all the necessary steps to strengthen border monitoring and surveillance.

In that regard the regional commanders of the Senegalese army have been instructed to take all necessary measures to prevent trafficking in arms or any related materiel to any destination.

They have also been requested to strengthen border surveillance in close cooperation with other national security forces, particularly the police, the Gendarmerie and the customs service.

While assuring him of the Senegalese Government's readiness to provide any other information that may be useful for the implementation of Security Council resolution 1572 (2004), the Permanent Mission of Senegal takes this opportunity to convey to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1572 (2004) concerning Côte d'Ivoire the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
