*Draft resolution E/2004/L.5: Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Guinea-Bissau*

1. **The President** drew attention to draft resolution E/2004/L.5, entitled “Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Guinea-Bissau”.

2. *Draft resolution E/2004/L.5 was adopted.*

*Draft resolution E/2004/L.6: Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Burundi*

3. **The President** drew attention to draft resolution E/2004/L.6, entitled “Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Burundi”.

4. *Draft resolution E/2004/L.6 was adopted.*

5. **Mr. Nteturuye** (Burundi) thanked the Council and the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Burundi for their support in furthering the process of normalization in Burundi.

6. **Mr. Lolo** (Nigeria), thanking the Council and Nigeria’s partners for adopting the draft resolution, said that during the substantive session of the Council his delegation would request that the Advisory Group on Burundi take on the responsibility of monitoring events in that country.

*Theme for the humanitarian affairs segment of the substantive session of 2004*

7. **The President** proposed that the Council adopt the theme for the humanitarian affairs segment of its 2004 substantive session entitled “Strengthening of the coordination of humanitarian assistance of the United Nations: present and future challenges”, and the themes for the panels entitled (a) “Strengthening preparedness and response to natural disasters, with an emphasis on capacity-building” and (b) “Field-level coordination for the purpose of continuing the presence and operation of United Nations humanitarian assistance missions in higher-risk environments”.

8. *It was so decided.*
