Summary of Lebanon's follow-up Actions

- ▶ Bridging the Digital Divide
 - Increase Internet and PC penetrations
 50 /600 villages are now on-line PC4all (24,000 PCs/yr)
 - Lowering Internet prices
 by 30% on Dial-up, by 75% on Leased Lines since 2003
 - Improving local content
 e-commerce, e-banking, e-government


Summary of Lebanon's follow-up Actions

- Enabling Blocks to the Information Society
 - Implementing the National e-Strategy
 Presented to the heads of state in May 2004
 - Creating PPP and MSP
 - Establishing the legal framework for e-transactions ECOMLEB (digital signature and proof, contracts online, consumer protection, IPR, data privacy, cyber crimes, international issues)

Summary of Lebanon's follow-up Actions

- ▶ The Establishment of the National WSIS Committee
 - Supported by the Ministerial ICT Committee
 - Ground root volunteer basis
 - Encompassing all stakeholders from the Public, Private, NGOs, and academia
 - Three working groups in support of national preparations for WSIS phase II formed – NWGIG, NWGSF & NWGL



Lessons Learned and Challenges

- ▶ Raising the National Priority Level for e-initiatives and other WSIS undertakings
- ▶ Agreeing on concrete sustainable developmental projects on the national level
- ▶ Thinking of innovative Funding channels
- ▶ Going beyond the digital divide and creating useful applications for all groups of society
