Issues relating to registry systems under Article 7, paragraph 4, of the Kyoto Protocol

Draft conclusions proposed by the Chair

- 1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) took note of the progress report on work relating to registry systems (FCCC/SBSTA/2004/12) and the report on the intersessional consultations on registry systems (FCCC/SBSTA/2004/INF.18).
- 2. The SBSTA decided to recommend a draft decision on issues relating to registry systems (FCCC/SBSTA/2004/L.29/Add.1) for adoption by the Conference of the Parties at its tenth session.
- 3. The SBSTA noted that, in accordance with decision 16/CP.9, the secretariat provided Parties with an indication of the administrative and budgetary implications of the draft decision. It further noted that the additional resources required to implement this draft decision have not been provided for in the programme budget for 2004–2005 and that the draft decision can be implemented during 2005 only upon receipt of timely and sufficient contributions to the UNFCCC Trust Fund for Supplementary Activities for this purpose.
- 4. The SBSTA also noted, without prejudice to the consideration of the draft programme budget by the Subsidiary Body for Implementation at its twenty-second session, that options for the provision of resources for this work beyond 2005 are to be considered in the programme budget for 2006–2007.
