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## Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

## Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2005/15 of 25 February 2005, S/2005/15/Add.20 of 31 May 2005 and S/2005/15/Add.21 of 7 June 2005.

During the week ending 2 July 2005 the Security Council took action on the following items:

**Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan** (*see* S/2004/20/Add.23, 30, 35, 37, 39, 40, 44, 46 and 49; and S/2005/15/Add.1, 4-6, 9-12 and 18; *see also* S/2003/40/Add.40; and S/2004/20/Add.21 and 43)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5216th and 5217th (private) meetings, held on 29 June 2005 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the 5216th meeting, in accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Luis Moreno-Ocampo, Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.

At the close of the 5217th meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

"At its 5217th meeting, held in private on 29 June 2005, the Security Council considered the item entitled 'Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan'.

"In accordance with the decision taken at the 5216th meeting, the President extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Luis Moreno-Ocampo, Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.

"The members of the Council and Mr. Moreno-Ocampo had an exchange of views after the briefing."

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5218th meeting, held on 29 June 2005 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the special report of the Secretary-General on elections in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (S/2005/320).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2005/27; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5219th meeting, held on 30 June 2005 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the twenty-fifth report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission in Sierra Leone (S/2005/273 and Add.1).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Sierra Leone, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2005/418) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2005/418, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1610 (2005) (for the text, see S/RES/1610 (2005); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

Africa's food crisis as a threat to peace and security (see S/2002/30/Add.48; and S/2003/40/Add.14)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5220th meeting, held on 30 June 2005 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to James Morris, Executive Director of the World Food Programme.
