The Permanent Mission of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela presents its compliments to the International Atomic Energy Agency and wishes to take this opportunity to refer to resolution GOV/2005/64 entitled "Implementation of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons Safeguards Agreement in the Islamic Republic of Iran and related Board resolutions", adopted by the Board of Governors on 11 August 2005.

In that regard, the Permanent Mission, as a member of the Board, wishes to express its disagreement with the procedure by which the resolution was negotiated and approved, since it did not allow the equitable participation of all the States present in the discussion and adoption of a document of such importance.

For the reasons stated above, the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela hereby expresses its disagreement with resolution GOV/2005/64, believing that it undermines the development of the Iranian people and of all those countries with an interest in exercising their inalienable right to use nuclear energy for peaceful purposes.
