I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1988, the General Assembly decided to include in the agenda of its forty-third session the item entitled "Programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 7th, 8th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 14th, 16th, 18th, 19th, 21st, 23rd, 24th, 27th, 29th, 30th, 31st, 33rd, 36th, 37th, 39th to 48th, 50th and 51st meetings, on 12, 13, 18, 19, 20, 24, 25, 27, 28 and 31 October, on 1, 2, 9, 11, 14, 15, 17, 21, 23 and 30 November, and 2, 5, 6, 8, 9, 12, 13, 14, 15, 18 and 19 December 1988.
3. The comments and observations made in the course of the discussion of this item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/43/SR.7, 8, 10-12, 14, 16, 18, 19, 21, 23, 24, 27, 29, 30, 31, 33, 36, 37, 39 to 48, 50 and 51).
4. Section II of the present report contains a summary of the recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session on the revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly either on the recommendation of its Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with in plenary meetings.
5. Section III of the report provides a summary of the special subjects considered by the Fifth Committee, other than the programme budget implications of draft resolutions, which led to the adoption of specific decisions (other than appropriations) to be recommended to the General Assembly.
6. The recommendations of the Fifth Committee are contained in section IV of the present report.

II. PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1988-1989

7. By its resolutions 42/226 A and B of 21 December 1987, the General Assembly approved appropriations for the biennium 1988-1989 in the amount of \$1,769,586,300 and estimates of income in the amount of \$337,330,200.
8. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session of the General Assembly on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General, as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with in plenary meetings, have resulted in net increases in the approved level of appropriations in the amount of \$19,160,000 and net increases in the approved estimates of income in the amount of \$7,113,100.
9. The revised estimates of expenditure and income approved by the Fifth Committee and the financial implications of resolutions recommended by other Main Committees and subsequently approved by the General Assembly are indicated, by expenditure and income section, below:

37. 41. At the same meeting, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General (see para. 51, draft resolution I, sect. XI).

15. Revised estimates under section 28 (Administration and management): Establishment of an integrated management information system

42. The Committee considered this question at its 42nd, 44th and 45th meetings, on 6, 9 and 12 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/43/24) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/43/7/Add.10).

43. At its 45th meeting, the Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 83 to 4, with 21 abstentions, to recommend to the General Assembly that it (a) approve the implementation, within a three and one-half year period, of phase I of the integrated management information system project at a total cost not to exceed \$28 million at 1988 rates; (b) authorize the Secretary-General to administer flexibly and to allocate among the cost centres identified in his report (A/C.5/43/24, paras. 50 and 51) the total cost established for the project; (c) approve an additional appropriation of \$3,425,700 under section 28A (Office of the Under-Secretary-General for Administration and Management) of the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989, as well as an additional appropriation of \$358,400 under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an increase in the same amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment); and (d) approve the understanding of the Secretary-General concerning the use and application of voluntary funds, as contained in paragraph 53 of his report. The Committee took its decision on the understanding that the Secretary-General, in implementing the project, would take into consideration the views expressed by Member States, would endeavour to contain costs, to take measures for effective co-ordination between the centres concerned and to ensure that the experience of other organisations of the United Nations system is fully taken into account and would report to the General Assembly, through the Advisory Committee, at its forty-fourth session on the progress made in the implementation of this project including the cost effectiveness, benefits and contributions to the administrative reforms in progress (see para. 51, draft resolution I, sect. XII).

16. First performance report on the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989

45. The Committee considered this question at its 47th meeting, on 14 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/43/30 and Add.1 and Add.1/Corr.1) and the related reports of the Advisory Committee (A/43/7/Add.11 and 12).

46. At the same meeting, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it approve a net decrease of \$1,143,100 in the appropriations approved for the biennium 1988-1989, and a net increase of \$1,240,700 in the estimates of income for the biennium 1988-1989, to be apportioned as indicated in paragraph 4 of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/43/30/Add.1 and Corr.1). The Committee also decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it concur in the observations of the Advisory Committee as contained in its reports (A/43/7/Add.11 and 12) (see para. 51, draft resolution I, sect. XIII).

17. Revised estimates for the biennium 1988-1989, including plans for the implementation of recommendation 15 of the Group of High-level Intergovernmental Experts on the reduction of personnel, as requested by the General Assembly in resolutions 41/213 and 42/211

47. The Committee considered this question in conjunction with agenda item 49, Review of the efficiency of the administrative and financial functioning of the United Nations, at its 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 14th, 16th, 18th, 19th, 20th, 21st, 23rd, 24th and 50th meetings, on 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, 20, 24, 25, 26, 28 and 31 October and 1, 2 November and 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/43/1/Rev.1 and Add.1 and Add.2) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/43/651 and Add.1).

48. At its 50th meeting, the Vice-Chairman introduced draft resolution A/C.5/43/L.19, submitted following informal consultations. At the same meeting, the Fifth Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly the adoption of draft resolution A/C.5/43/L.19 (see A/43/951). Also at the same meeting, the Fifth Committee approved the revised estimates contained in A/C.5/43/Rev.1/Add.1 and Add.2.

18. Separation payments for the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation and the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme

49. The Committee considered this question at its 50th meeting, on 18 December. It had before it the report of the Advisory Committee (A/43/7/Add.13 and Corr.1).

50. At the same meeting, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it concur with the recommendation of the Advisory Committee concerning the separation payments for the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation and the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme (see para. 52, draft decision).

Budget appropriations in a total amount of \$US 900,853,150, consisting of \$US 884,793,150, being one half of the appropriations initially approved for the biennium 1988-1989 by General Assembly resolution 42/226 A of 21 December 1987, plus \$US 19,160,000, being the increase in appropriations approved during the forty-third session by resolution A above, less \$US 3,100,000, being the reduction resulting from savings in liquidation of obligations for the biennium 1984-1985 surrendered in accordance with General Assembly resolution 40/236 A, paragraph 6, shall be financed in accordance with regulations 5.1 and 5.2 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations as follows:

(a) \$35,706,650, consisting of:

- (i) \$25,155,150, being half of the estimated income approved for the biennium 1988-1989 by resolution 42/226 B of 21 December 1987 other than staff assessment income and excluding the estimated income in section 2 (\$16 million) in respect of the repayment on the loan to the United Nations Industrial Development Organization; and
- (ii) \$10,551,500, being the increase in estimated income other than staff assessment income approved by resolution B above;

(b) \$865,146,500, being the assessment on Member States in accordance with General Assembly resolution 43/223 of 21 December 1988 on the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;

2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund in the total amount of \$US 118,072,438, consisting of:

(a) \$135,509,950, being half of the estimated staff assessment income approved by resolution 42/226 B;

(b) Less \$3,438,400, being the estimated decrease in income from staff assessment approved by resolution B above;

(c) Less \$13,999,112, being the decrease in income from staff assessment compared to the approved revised estimates for the biennium 1986-1987, approved by General Assembly resolution 42/213 B of 21 December 1987.
