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PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1988-1989

Report of the Fifth Committee

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I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1988, the General Assembly decided to include in the agenda of its forty-third session the item entitled "Programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
- 2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 7th, 8th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 14th, 16th, 18th, 19th, 21st, 23rd, 24th, 27th, 29th, 30th, 31st, 33rd, 36th, 37th, 39th to 48th, 50th and 51st meetings, on 12, 13, 18, 19, 20, 24, 25, 27, 28 and 31 October, on 1, 2, 9, 11, 14, 15, 17, 21, 23 and 30 November, and 2, 5, 6, 8, 9, 12, 13, 14, 15, 18 and 19 December 1988.
- 3. The comments and observations made in the course of the discussion of this item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/43/SR.7, 8, 10-12, 14, 16, 18, 19, 21, 23, 24, 27, 29, 30, 31, 33, 36, 37, 39 to 48, 50 and 51).
- 4. Section II of the present report contains a summary of the recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session on the revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly either on the recommendation of its Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with in plenary meetings.
- 5. Section III of the report provides a summary of the special subjects considered by the Zifth Committee, other than the programme budget implications of draft resolutions, which led to the adoption of specific decisions (other than appropriations) to be recommended to the General Assembly.
- 6. The recommendations of the Fifth Committee are contained in section IV of the present report.

II. PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1988-1989

- 7. By its resolutions 42/226 A and B of 21 December 1987, the General Assembly approved appropriations for the biennium 1988-1989 in the amount of \$1,769,586,300 and estimates of income in the amount of \$337,330,200.
- 8. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session of the General Assembly on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General, as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with in plenary meetings, have resulted in net increases in the approved level of appropriations in the amount of \$19,160,000 and net increases in the approved estimates of income in the amount of \$7,113,100.
- 9. The revised estimates of expenditure and income approved by the Fifth Committee and the financial implications of resolutions recommended by other Main Committees and subsequently approved by the General Assembly are indicated, by expenditure and income section, below:

- 47. The Committee considered this question in conjunction with agenda item 49, Review of the efficiency of the administrative and financial functioning of the United Nations, at its 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 14th, 16th, 18th, 19th, 20th, 21st, 23rd, 24th and 50th meetings, on 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, 20, 24, 25, 26, 28 and 31 October and 1, 2 November and 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/43/1/Rev.1 and Add.1 and Add.2) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/43/651 and Add.1).

- 48. At its 50th meeting, the Vice-Chairman introduced draft resolution A/C.5/43/L.19, submitted following informal consultations. At the same meeting, the Fifth Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly the adoption of draft resolution A/C.5/43/L.19 (see A/43/951). Also at the same meeting, the Fifth Committee approved the revised estimates contained in A/C.5/43/Rev.1/Add.1 and Add.2.

Budget appropriations in a total amount of \$US 900,853,150, consisting of \$US 884,793,150, being one half of the appropriations initially approved for the biennium 1988-1989 by General Assembly resolution 42/226 A of 21 December 1987, plus \$US 19,160,000, being the increase in appropriations approved during the forty-third session by resolution A above, less \$US 3,100,000, being the reduction resulting from savings in liquidation of obligations for the biennium 1984-1985 surrendered in accordance with General Assembly resolution 40/236 A, paragraph 6, shall be financed in accordance with regulations 5.1 and 5.2 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations as follows:
 - (a) \$35,706,650, consisting of:
 - (i) \$25,155,150, being half of the estimated income approved for the biennium 1988-1989 by resolution 42/226 B of 21 December 1987 other than staff assessment income and excluding the estimated income in section 2 (\$16 million) in respect of the repayment on the loan to the United Nations Industrial Development Organization; and
 - (ii) \$10,551,500, being the increase in estimated income other than staff assessment income approved by resolution B above;
- (b) \$865,146,500, being the assessment on Member States in accordance with General Assembly resolution 43/223 of 21 December 1988 on the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;
- 2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund in the total amount of \$US 118,072,438, consisting of:
- (a) \$135,509,950, being half of the estimated staff assessment income approved by resolution 42/226 B;
- (b) Less \$3,438,400, being the estimated decrease in income from staff assessment approved by resolution B above;
- (c) Less \$13,999,112, being the decrease in income from staff assessment compared to the approved revised estimates for the biennium 1986-1987, approved by General Assembly resolution 42/213 B of 21 December 1987.
