Letter dated 10 November 2005 from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1132 (1997) concerning Sierra Leone addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to refer to resolution 1171 (1998), adopted by the Security Council on 5 June 1998, concerning Sierra Leone. Under paragraph 4 of the resolution, the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1132 (1997) concerning Sierra Leone is required to report to the Council on notifications received from States on the export of arms and related materiel to Sierra Leone, as well as on notifications of imports of arms and related materiel made by the Government of Sierra Leone.

Accordingly, I wish to inform you that the Committee received a notification on 3 November 2005 from the Government of the United Kingdom regarding a request for a trade licence for the export of armoured cars from Jordan to Sierra Leone for use by the Special Court. The details are as follows:

- Goods: 3 x armoured Toyota landcruisers protected to North Atlantic Treaty Organization level B6
- End-user: Special Court Sierra Leone Jomo Kenyatta Road Freetown Sierra Leone
- End-use: The vehicles are to be used to move indictees at short notice or for the protection of Special Court staff in Sierra Leone.
