Item 1 Organizational matters

In accordance with rule 7 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board of UNDP and UNFPA, the Board will elect a new Bureau consisting of a President and four Vice-Presidents. According to the established pattern of rotation of posts among the various regional groups, the President of the Executive Board for 2006 should be elected from the Board members of the Eastern European States group.

Under this item, the Executive Board will adopt the agenda and agree on the work plan for the session as presented by the Secretary of the Board. The Board will also approve the report of its second regular session 2005. A draft report was distributed to members of the Board for their comments; the final report contains comments received within the deadline.

In accordance with decision 96/25, a work plan for 2006 was prepared by the secretariat in close consultation with the Bureau of the Board and is submitted to the Board for adoption.

The Board will also continue the discussion on improving its working methods.

Item 2 Multi-year funding framework

In response to Executive Board decision 2005/20, UNDP will present a timeline for the preparation of its report on the end-of-cycle assessment of performance of the MYFF, 2004-2007, as well as for the process leading to the preparation of the MYFF, 2008-2011. While the Executive Board has already agreed on the basic methodology and conceptual design for reporting on the current MYFF, UNDP continues to consider ways to refine the quality of reporting in an effort to strengthen the oversight by the Executive Board of UNDP operations. The process leading to the preparation of the MYFF, 2008-2011, will enable the Executive Board to consider the evolving role of UNDP in the United Nations reform and follow-up to the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness as well as the 2005 World Summit

Outcome. The present document outlines the consultative process with the Executive Board.

Item 3 Country programmes and related matters

In accordance with the Governing Council and Executive Board mandate governing UNDP assistance to Myanmar (decisions 93/21, 96/1, 98/14, 2001/15, 2003/2, 2004/2 and 2005/3), an independent annual assessment of the UNDP Human Development Initiative projects was carried out in Myanmar in July 2005. Further to the oral presentation by the Resident Representative at the second regular session in September 2005, the report of the assessment mission to Myanmar is now presented to the Board. Item 4 Evaluation

In response to the Executive Board recommendation that UNDP undertake an evaluation of gender mainstreaming in order to assess the progress of the organization to date and its contributions to promoting women's empowerment and gender equality, the Evaluation Office initiated an independent evaluation in 2004. The evaluation assessed the overall performance of UNDP in gender mainstreaming in the last ten years. The scope covered four specific areas: (a) UNDP commitment to and advocacy of gender mainstreaming and gender equality; (b) the translation of this commitment into UNDP programmes and projects; (c) the reflection of gender mainstreaming and gender equality in the organization itself; and (d) the nature of strategic partnerships forged to promote gender mainstreaming and gender equality.

At the annual session 2005 the Board received an oral briefing on preliminary findings of the evaluation. The present report and the management response (document DP/2006/7) are now being presented for a full discussion.
