NOTE CONCERNING COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF
THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF HONDURAS

(Memorandum by the Secretary-General)

1. The Secretary-General, in compliance with paragraph (e) of Resolution No. 75 (V) of the Economic and Social Council sent Memoranda to certain Member-States not represented on the Commission on Human Rights furnishing the Governments of these States with a brief indication of the substance of communications concerning human rights received by the United Nations from 1 January to 24 October 1947, which referred explicitly to these States or to territories under their jurisdiction without divulging the identity of the authors of the communications.
2. The Secretary-General has received two communications in reply to his Memoranda, one from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of the Government of the Dominican Republic, dated 6 April 1948, and one from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of the Government of the Republic of Honduras, dated 5 April 1948.
3. The Commission on Human Rights may wish to express its views regarding the procedure to be followed with these and similar communications since Resolution 75 (V) does not expressly provide for the handling of such communications.
